



Associate of Arts in Construction Management – Direct Transfer Agreement/Major Related Program (DTA/MRP)

Your Program

- This program is for students who want to transfer to a participating Washington State four-year college or university.
- The Construction Management DTA/MRP meets all requirements of Washington’s Direct Transfer Agreement, between baccalaureate institutions offering an American Council for Construction Education (ACCE) accredited bachelor of science in construction management (CWU, WSU, UW-Seattle, EWU) and the community and technical college system.
- The program consists of 90 college-level credits. At least 60 of these credits are *general education* in areas like communication, mathematics, humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences.
- When you finish your Construction Management DTA/MRP, if you are admitted to a four-year degree program, you will have junior standing. You will have met all prerequisites except as noted by specific universities.
- You also will meet the prerequisites for other bachelor degrees – construction is not your only possible destination!
- **The minimum cumulative GPA is 2.0.** Each individual course must have a minimum grade of 1.0.

Important Notes and Conditions

- Completion of this degree does not guarantee admission to any baccalaureate university.
- A course cannot be credited toward more than one distribution area.
- “S” grades are not allowed.
- A minimum of 30 credits of the applied 90, including the last quarter, must be completed at RTC.
- Universities may have other specific admissions requirements in addition to those of the transfer degree.
- Baccalaureate construction management preparation programs typically require a higher overall GPA than the minimum 2.0 needed to complete this degree.
- Admission to a four-year degree program in construction management is selective. Check criteria for selection by connecting with your future transfer institution.
- All four universities who are part of this DTA/MRP agreement will take up to 95 transfer credits.

Counseling/Advising Notes and Recommendations

- This worksheet is only for counseling/advising purposes. Official approval of credits for degree completion is subject to the Credentials Office approval.

Financial Aid Eligibility

- Submit an application for Financial Aid at www.fafsa.gov. The Financial Aid office will receive your information and will be able to advise you of your eligibility.
- Remember – you can only register for classes that are required for your program.
- Pay special attention to the Financial Aid *Satisfactory Progress Policy*. Your Financial Aid depends on it.

Transferability of Credits

- For an official review, submit a completed Transcript Translation Request form along with sealed transcript(s) from the prior institution(s) to the Credentials Office in Enrollment Services.
- Renton Technical College is fully accredited. Academic courses will usually be accepted by other institutions offering the same or similar courses. However, each institution has its own transfer policies and each student is responsible for knowing the transfer and admission requirements of the receiving institution. Students are urged to consult with their counselor/advisor and a representative from the college they plan to attend after RTC.
